

RESEARCH ASSISTANT (PART-TIME)

IMBA (Institute of Molecular Biotechnology) of the Austrian Academy of Science is an internationally recognized research institute that focuses on molecular medicine, stem cell research and RNA biology and is home to 200 scientists of over 30 nationalities. It locates in the Campus Vienna Biocenter, very close to the city center of Vienna. Science carried out in IMBA is absolutely at the top level and IMBA carries a great state-of-the-art infrastructure and the top research programs for the different career-level of scientists. We have a vacancy for a part-time research assistant (with an option to full-time depending on external funding) to join the team of Sasha Mendjan's lab.

The main responsibilities will be activities supporting research projects in our group including molecular analysis (RT-qPCR, ICC, flow cytometry, RNA-seq, CRISPR and protein extract preparation for proteomics) as well as maintenance and experiments with human stem cells.

Successful applicants should have strong molecular biology background, good basic manual and visual skills (such as required in tissue culture) and feel keen for advanced training in stem cell differentiation. He or she should be friendly, well-organised, highly motivated and willing to learn new techniques, able to work independently, as well as in a team. Good English-language communication skills are essential. The annual gross salary starts from € 35.350,- (full-time, 40hrs) depending on qualification and experience.

We offer a young, dynamic, and international working environment, further training in molecular biology and genetics, and the chance to make an

important contribution to basic biomedical research.
